

# THEODORE WITT DEAD, AT 84

Had Never Been Sick Before  
Last Thursday—Resident of  
City 56 Years

Theodore Witt, age 84 years, died at the home, 910 Vino street, Sunday afternoon at 3:30 o'clock of pneumonia.

Mr. Witt had been a resident of Evansville for 56 years, coming to the United States when two years of age from Germany. He had never been sick a day in his life until last Thursday.
