There was silence, the altar bell tolled and Cardinal Dougherty elevated the host on high. Heads were bowed in adoration as the cardinal made the sign of the cross with the monstrance.

Again the thousands went to their knees and the voice of the pope pronounced his benediction. Following the papal legate's words, the congregation sang the congress hymn, and the 33rd international eucharistic congress was terminated officially.
